

What happens? You Act inappropriately by scolding the child, maybe even sending him to his room for being what? Playful?

Now think of your dog.

Gets up, has a good breakfast. Has a great walk and smells lots of "pee" mail. Goes on a car ride, but turns out to be to the vet. At the Vet, only got a nail trim which wasn't too bad, but there were some scary dogs there. As a reward for being good, on the way home went to the dog park and played for an hour with lots of nice dogs. At home again, forgot to sit before food was put down for supper and owner had to ask twice. Finally got to lie down and relax but one of the kids was running by and accidentally stepped on leg.

What happens? The dog may act inappropriately by jumping up, snarling, maybe snapping or even a bite!

Stress, whether good stress or bad, is still stress. You may think the dog had a great day – a good walk, a nice nail trim, playing at the dog park and in the process, having a couple of nice car rides.

Stress is stress - think of happy occasions or sad ones, both cause stress. Stress is cumulative and can cause humans and animals both to act out. Please remember this when your dog reacts unexpectedly and acts aggressively, or even submissively, "out of nowhere" It wasn't out of nowhere, it is a result of built up stress.

We ask our dogs to live by our rules in our world, but please try to understand how your dog must feel in this foreign land. Speak his language once in awhile and try to view things from his perspective.
