#### Can Dogs Understand Humans?

Dogs learn the meaning of individual words and phrases and understand your tone, facial expressions and body language, such as pointing. Communication over time can be shared with you and your dog which is unique from your experience together and your knowledge of the breed and upbringing.

While dogs can understand humans, there are limits. Once we get into full sentences things seem to break

down. Saying that one word is more understanding to our dogs.

A dog's language is made up of body language. They understand human facial expression, our posture and our gestures such as pointing. We also must read a dog's body languages as well. Dogs give us signals that let you know they are in distress - tense posture, dilated pupils, rapid breathing or constant fidgeting. On the other hand a happy, relaxed dog will show loose posture and a wagging tail.

In communicating with our dogs, as our dogs age, we need to find other than words to speak to them. The use of hand signals and facial expressions at an early age will help them as they age. One source of training is having your dog paired with a blinking light at a young age for a "come" command. As an example: When you put your dog outside at bedtime, the use of your outdoor light blinking 3x's, would have the dog, "come".

Dogs really understand humans quite a bit. It is just how each of us takes the time to learn from them.
