Most people attend dog training classes because they believe their dog has a behavior problem. The problem often lies not with the dog but with how the person handles his dog. If you confuse your dog in what you are trying to achieve in your training, it becomes impossible to correct the unwanted behavior.

If something is not working in your training, try to make a change and see if it makes it easier for your dog to understand what you are trying to teach

him. One little change can bring out the best in your dog.

Patience is a very important tool when training our dogs. Beginner dogs learn by leaps and bounds, but sometimes a particular exercise can become frustrating to the owner and the dog becomes confused by the anger in a handler's voice. The process of a dog's performance should be a delicate procedure. A small mistake should bring only a small correction followed by praise. Do not let yourself fall into the trap of saying, "He should know this by now", or "He does so well at home". If he isn't doing it, he obviously doesn't know it yet and he needs more time and patience on your part and you need to re-evaluate your training approach.

I cannot stress enough that before you can achieve success in dog training you must teach your dog "focus". If the dog's mind wanders, no amount of words or treats will get him into a different frame of mind until the only thing that matters is YOU. Working at home through the day with a marker word, such as GOOD or YES when your dog is watching you is the beginning of a bond that will help as the dog is worked outside the home in different situations and at Class. Once the dog finds you are the most important object in the world, training new exercises will become easier to attain.

Now that we have the opportunity to be inside the gym, getting the dog to focus on you will help once we return to the Marina with many more distractions.

Remember a well-trained dog takes an obvious joy in what he is doing because he knows he is pleasing someone he loves - his owner.
