Our Club has been very successful in training our dogs as a group. I say this because it is up to the owner to observe, teach, and practice their dogs, all an instructor can do is guide each dog in exercises that will help him learn to become a "Good Citizen".

We have dogs with a range of temperaments, and it is up to the owner, with the help of the instructor, to work in these situations. Many come to class with high expectations but you must remember not to "keep up" with other dogs and recognize small victories in your own dog.

One of the most important lessons to teach your dog is "focus". Once the dog has your attention, following through with an exercise becomes easier. This lesson begins in your home and gradually worked in other areas so when you come to class he has the skill to

follow your instruction.

Many times a dog needs a "time out". He can be moved to the side, watch other dogs and work on an exercise away from the group.

When training, it is always better to set your dog up for success in baby steps. If a dog owner realizes that his dog may fail in certain exercises, bark at other dogs, may shut down, it helps take the emotions out of training. Remember, it's all okay! That's why you're here - to learn how to best help your dog.

One advantage to group training is having your dog socialized around other dogs and feel good about it.

Listen to your dog - he will tell you what he needs in the moment. You're in class to help your dog, not to keep up with the Joneses. Once your dog's emotional state improves, the basic skill behaviors will come.
