### **Old Friends**

Wishing everyone Happy New Year and may you all enjoy a year of blessings with your dog. I am thankful for all your help in our training with the STDTC.

Dog Training is also a part of the PA State prison system for 12 years. Dogs have given inmates a sense of pride, accomplishment and opportunity to give something positive back to society. The inmates rehabilitate and teach socialization skills to unwanted shelter dogs or neutered puppies to become service dogs for people with physical or emotional needs.

At SCI Graterford it is a 12 week training curriculum for the inmate participants called "Saving and Reclaiming Lives". A non-profit organization called "New Leash on Life" monitors the program and dogs are brought to the institution from at-risk shelters.

This program prepares dogs with specialized skills to support wounded warriors who experience the impacts of PTSD. The inmates attend workshops on life skills, job readiness, basic animal care and positive reinforcement training with the possibility of earning internships in the animal care field when they are paroled. During the 12 week program the dogs live in the cell block 24/7 with the inmates.

Exercises used at Graterford is both physical and mental. Training your dog is always number one. One of the favorite exercises is using a Kong Wobbler that dispenses food and allows dogs to "work" for their food instead of eating out of a bowl. Their food is their paycheck so to speak. The dog is entertaining himself and he has earned it.

The FIDOS Program at Coal Township started in July 2014 and dogs are brought from a kennel of dogs needing a home. Obedience Training is done twice a week and the dogs are then available for adoption through the kennel which included spaying/neutering, shots and microchip. The program has helped inmates with mental illness, separation from family. As one handler stated "he feels good everyday knowing that he is helping save a dog's life. When the dogs leave our facility, it is as if they are brand new dogs".

At SCI Albion dogs are in a program, Canine Partners for Life (CPL) which provides highly-trained service dogs for individuals with physical, cognitive and developmental disabilities. It takes 2 years to raise and train a CPL service dog. The dog comes as a puppy and is taught basic obedience. At 14 months of age they are returned to the CPL campus for advance training and are adopted at 20 months of age.

A testimonial from an inmate, "A little piece of us leaves with each dog we train. We also feel that we are giving to society even though we took from society with the crime we committed."
