## **Old Friends**

With summer vacations upon us, we must think of how our pets will be taken care of while we are away.

#### #1 Pet Sitter:

- 1. Leave a schedule time leaving and time of return
  - 2. How to contact you (cell phone, E-mail)
  - 3. Feeding schedule how many scoops
  - 4. Medical info and your veterinarian
- 5. Some of your command words
- 6. Exercise instructions
- 7. House rules
- 8. Where equipment is kept, leash, brush
- 9. Let the sitter know of any behavior concerns the dog may

have.

#2 If your dog is housed at a kennel, some of the same will apply.

#3 Traveling - Many people traveling today may choose to take their pets with them since they now have pet-friendly hotels, motels, and camp grounds that welcome well-behaved, housebroken, leashed, flea-less, furry friends.

You must do your homework first and check to see what facilities cater to pets.

Packing your pet's suitcase should include fresh water, your pet's regular food (an abrupt change in diet can make your pet ill), grooming supplies, clean-up bags and a first-aid kit.

Also if your pet is used to a small crate or a mat it is used to sleeping on, this will help him adjust when you may be away from the dog. Also, his favorite toy. Sometimes leaving a shirt which has your scent and left with the dog will make him comfortable if left alone. A copy of the dog's shot record should include the rabies certificate. In case your dog is swimmer, be sure to bring a beach towel.

Remember to have an ID tag on your dog and place a disc with your cell phone # on the collar in case your dog should get lost.

#### **Old Friends (Continued)**

One item which is very beneficial is a copy of your "Canine Good Citizen" certificate. This proves valuable to many facilities since they know you have a well-mannered pet. Some have mentioned TDI but they are more familiar with CGC. By going on-line, you are able to connect with places that will accept pets.

Last but not least, no animal should be left in a car, even for a few minutes. And if you should see an animal in such distress a call to the police is in order.

A cool treat for Dog:

3C plain non-fat yogurt

1C Peanut butter (unsalted)

1Tbs. Honey

Combine thoroughly. Pour into ice cub tray, freeze solid at least 2 hrs. Pop and serve.

I have frozen left over soup or broth in ice cube trays and find the dogs enjoy this summer time treat.

# **Breed of the Month Spinone Italiano**

Keep a dry towel and a sense of humor handy for the lovable Spinone Italiano.

You can learn where a Spinone has been by looking at its beard. But once you look into their gaze they look you in the eye in a gentle, loving way and you know there's a whole lot going on in their heads. When it comes to food the Spinoni are notorious kitchen-counter surfers.

Despite the breed's charming personality the Spinone is shy and docile. You need to get them out and expose them to strange noises, people and other dogs and have them enrolled in group training classes.



Training the breed is fairly easy as long as it is something they want to do. The use of treats, lots of toys and some compromise should be included in the training.

The name Spinone means "very prickly" and refers to the breed's wiry coat. The breed originated in northern Italy as an all-purpose gun dog. They are strong swimmers, natural retrievers and versatile and efficient hunters bred to hunt either land game or waterfowl.

While Spinoni posses great endurance on the hunt, once past puppyhood he can become a couch potato content with its owner's company. The breeds naturally low energy indoors makes it a good therapy dog.

Spinoni also sport a clownish playful side and have a rapport with children. They seem to have a sixth sense to know who they can be rowdy with and who to be gentle with.
