In trying to keep our dogs healthy over these warm summer months, one note-worthy tip is to keep our dog's toys free of bacteria, such as staph, yeast and mold. Developing a cleaning schedule for your dog's bedding and toys can help keep both pets and people free of bacteria and allergens in the environment.

You can clean dishwasher-safe toys or a more natural approach. One way is soaking hard bones and toys in a bath of equal parts water and white vinegar and a sprinkle of baking soda.

This time of year we can see the development of hot spots with our dogs and as a suggestion from Judy & Doug Brubaker, I was able to get help for Patty who developed one after a trip to the beach.

You can take I cup of hot water and steep I tea bag in it. Add I aspirin and dissolve. Place the liquid in the fridge to cool. Use a paper towel and soak with the liquid 2-4 times a day. The hot spot will dry up quickly. It worked very well on Patty.

As we are hearing so much these days, ticks are everywhere and how to prevent having them on your dog can be a challenge. There are many effective preventatives on the market including oral, topical and effective collars.

Even though we have the ability to use preventatives, if we do hiking there are additional things we can use to help with exposure. Using sprays, especially on their feet, before a walk and having a tape roller handy to use if you see ticks on your dog can help control infestation. Always go over your dog with a brush and comb daily to protect him from ending up with a tick-borne disease.

As a note, it is not recommended to purchase low cost pesticide products from big box and grocery stores as they tend to have the highest rate of adverse effects and lowest effectiveness.
