## Old Friends by *Connie Cuff*

Recently, some of our members had the opportunity to visit a school and were able to educate them on greeting a dog and owner and bite prevention. With the summer months, we will encounter many children outdoors and it is a good time to teach them the proper etiquette of manners they should be aware of when approaching a dog.



As I have observed, many children have pets in their home and some have multiple. Studies have shown that interacting with and caring for pets are sources of developing behaviors and ideas related to nurturing others.

In a book by Barbara Shumamflang titled "Happy Kids, happy Dogs: Building a Friendship Right from the Start", she explains that parents must do three things to create a good relationship between their dog and their child: actively coach the child rather than merely supervise, teach the dog to have positive associations with the child, and evaluate interactions by monitoring the dog for signs of stress or other warning signs. She says it is essential to have a safety zone for the dog to go to when the dog shows signs of stress.

In Frank Ascione's "Children and Animals: Explaining the Roots of Kindness and Cruelty", he writes about the relationship between the abuse of animals and both physical

and sexual violence toward people. As an indication of future problems, a child's cruelty to animals often shows up at an earlier age than bullying, vandalism or cruelty to people. He focuses on the importance of developing the ability to empathize with animals while young and the links between empathy for animals and empathy for people.

Even if you have no children in your household, you may be a grandparent or know of a family who has young children and a pet. A little nurturing and education on your part could help with the human and pet bond and eliminate the need for families to turn their dogs over to shelters because they are out of control and do not get along with their children.

A little information can go a long way in helping everyone.
