Just what is meant by temperament in dogs? In the basic sense, it is the mental and physical reaction to a stimulus. It is difficult to separate temperament from personality in the canine. The pack order, domesticated from the wolf, consists of alpha dog, middle of the road and submissive dog. Understanding this pecking order is crucial to understanding the temperament of the individual dog. You cannot change the genetic makeup of a dog and temperament should be included in the makeup.

Each dog breed has a specific standard with certain characteristics for a particular breed. Retrievers retrieve, Guardian breeds protect, Herding dogs herd and so on. In this

modern day, few dogs perform the tasks they were developed for, so temperament should be a primary consideration.

Many dogs are rescued and since they are a mix of breeds, many have used the DNA to determine what types of dogs are included in the mix. This helps in determining the dog's characteristics and personality.

As an owner, you want your pup to have their rightful place in your home and society. That is why owners should be encouraged to attend a Star Puppy class and add a CGC.

From the time a pup has received its 2 sets of shots it can attend classes. Socializing your dog at an early age, gives it the foundation it needs to get along in the outside world. I have seen too many dogs continue living in their home, never walked (people say they have a fenced in yard) and down the road having aggressive issues.

Yes, that little cute puppy has now grown into its teen age years and people wonder what happened. As Club Members we should try to educate and speak up for the good of these dogs who eventually will be given up or end up in a shelter.

We have a mix of breeds in the dog club of all ages and seeing how well they all can perform and socialize at class is a tribute to you as an owner for taking the time to train and come to class. Keeping them fit is a plus in working as a Therapy Dog.
