For those of us who have been working with our dogs as Therapy Dogs, we know how much unconditional love they are able to give when we visit.

Our experience this past month with Bucknell students and how they find us when we return could fill a book with stories such as - "I have a dog at home and I miss him"; "I would rather be here than doing anything else"; "He makes me feel so good."

All dogs are not made to do this work, there are other things than make them happy and keep them busy. If your dog loves agility, scent work, rally, lure coursing, all of these can have the same benefits of making the dogs feel good and us as well.

How do you know if your dog is loving the things you're asking him to do? There is a "consent testing" where you might use a procedure to see if your dog loves petting or letting someone else pet your dog.

- 1. Sit down in an enclosed area with you dog off-leash.
- 2. Rest one open hand on your leg or lap, palm up. Ideally the dog will approach, but you can call, but no treats.
- 3. When the dog approaches, initiate contact with a scratch under the chin, not over the head.
- 4. Use the 3 second rule. Pet for 3 seconds, then remove your hand. If the dog moves close or nudges your hand and has a relaxed facial expression, she is inviting more attention.
- 5. Repeat several times, continuing to use the 3 second rule. Be alert for signs that he has had enough. Repeat this process when allowing other people to pet your dog.

If your dog pulls your hand toward him, shoves nose under your hand, is relaxed, he is well on his way to becoming a therapy dog. If your dog ducks away, body is tense, yawns, scratches, or exhibits other stress signals, you know that he is not cut out to do this work.

I know with bringing dogs to class and having them socialize with other dogs is one benefit that will always be $\#_I$ in keeping us happy and the dogs happy too. We all need socialization whether it be in the dog's world or ours as well.
