### **Old Friends**

Some of your dog's "demand behaviors" might be cute, but others can be annoying or destructive. Teach him a better way to get what he wants!

A dog's demand behavior is her effort to communicate her wants and needs to you, and she becomes frustrated when she doesn't get what she wants. Instead of calling them annoying behaviors we could look at them as invaluable communications with potential to enhance the behavioral health of our canine members.

Does this mean we always give our dogs everything they ask for. Not at all. It means that we give them an acceptable way for communicating their wants and needs.

For an example, they are barking at you with "that look" in their eyes, it's usually because they want something from you. Your first line of defense is to teach your dog a more polite way to ask for what she wants. If you want this to work, be sure to be observant so that you see and can reinforce the new "ask" behavior a percentage of the time.

Some acceptable behaviors you can teach: Go lie down on an "ask" mat. Teach your dog a nose target object in your home, could be set up in multiple rooms. Pick up a designated favorite "ask" toy and drop at your feet. A trick such as lie down, roll over (Lizzie's favorite). If you have a bell ringing button toy, to have the dog push on an "ask".

The possibilities are endless, but you need to teach your dog something entirely new to be her "ask", but you must anticipate her behavior. Along with the new "ask" you must completely ignore any inappropriate behavior.

The bottom line is that you get the behavior you reinforce. You want your dog to learn to communicate more effectively with you. It's up to you to find a more appropriate way to help control her outcome. You'll both be happier for it.
