

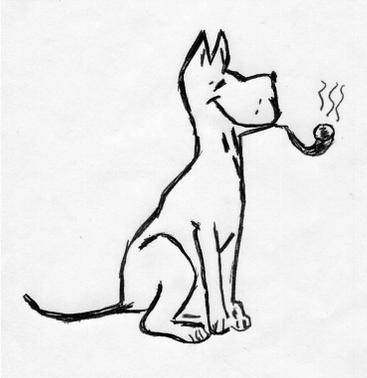

Our TDI/CGC testing at the PA Pets Dog Walk was a great success. We visited with many participants and offered them literature on how to be a responsible pet owner.

As fall approaches it is perhaps the best season to enjoy the outdoors with your dog. Bugs are on the decline and you can take advantage of fresh air and cool breezes.

Remember:

Fleas can continue to bug your pet through late summer and fall.

Update your dog's rabies vaccination. If you see your veterinarian please bring your up-dated shot record to class for our records).

Enjoy exercise with your pet. After exercise give small amounts of water while your dog cools down.

If your walk takes you off a road, be sure you and your dog are highly visible with reflective collars and vests.

If your dog gets into stickers or burrs, firmly but gently remove them and continue to brush him.

We choose our canine companions for many reasons, but knowing the characteristics and traits of each breed should help us in dealing with their behavior. This can show up in mixed breeds, also, when you know what makes up their breed.

Terriers were bred to chase down, dig up and kill small animals like rats and mice.

Working breeds such as Dobermans, Newfoundlands, Great Danes, Rottweilers and Boxers have a protective nature. These dogs tend to be pushier and show protective and territorial behavior.

Sporting dogs, Spaniels, Setters, Pointers, and Retrievers were bred as hunting dogs. These dogs have low aggression both to people and dogs, but high energy is their main trait.

Regardless of the breed, if a dog doesn't get the attention and exercise he needs, he'll try to entertain himself. Obedience at an early age is a good way to redirect the dog's natural traits and quirks and solve most canine behavior.

It is so nice to see our pets showing progress in class, and I have received compliments by people viewing our classes as to how well-trained they are. You all deserve a pat on the back for a job well done.

Directions to the Selinsgrove Center

Rt. 11 & 15 South entering Selinsgrove. After crossing a small bridge, make a right onto Rt. 522. Pass a red light and continue on Rt. 522. Pass Driver Testing center on left. Come to arc lights and make a right into Selinsgrove Center. Continue straight and you will go over 3 slow down bumps and come to a stop sign. Turn left for 20 ft. and make a right. **Immediately** make another right turn, come up a slight hill and you will see a one-way sign. Turn right and you will see the gym ahead of you. Drive behind the building to park. Be sure to lock all doors. No smoking on ground and drive carefully since clients may be walking at night.
